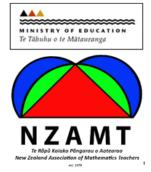

FAMOUS MATHEMATICIANS

Question 1 (\$20)



Roy Kerr is among the world's greatest mathematicians. He was born on 16 May 1934, Kurow, New Zealand.


Roy Patrick Kerr CNZM FRS FRSNZ discovered the Kerr geometry, an exact solution to the Einstein field equation of general relativity. His solution models the gravitational field outside an uncharged rotating massive object, including a rotating black hole.

Question 2 (\$20)

Leonhard Euler was born in Switzerland 15th April 1707 and died 18th September 1783 in Russia. He was a Swiss mathematician who made enormous contributions to a wide range of mathematics and physics including analytic geometry, trigonometry, geometry, calculus and number theory.

Question 3 (\$20)



Ernest Rutherford was awarded the Noble Peace for Chemistry in 1908. He was also a mathematician. Many scientific institutions, streets and school houses bear his name and his image appears on the \$100 note and on a stamp issued by New Zealand Post in 2008. He is the only New Zealander to have an element - rutherfordium - named in his honour. How old was Ernest Rutherford when died?

Sir Isaac Newton was one of the greatest mathematicians of all time. He was born in England on Christmas day, a sickly child not expected to live for long. He attended a grammar school in Grantham and Cambridge University.
