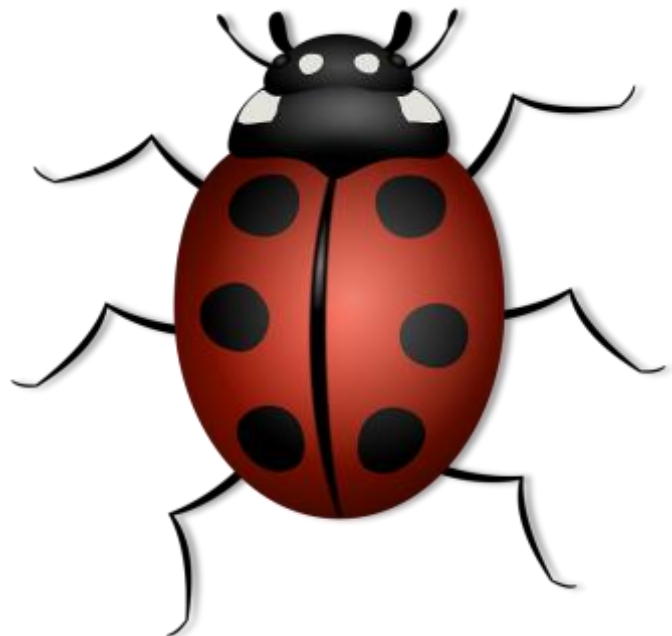
Rainbows!
