Task Three.

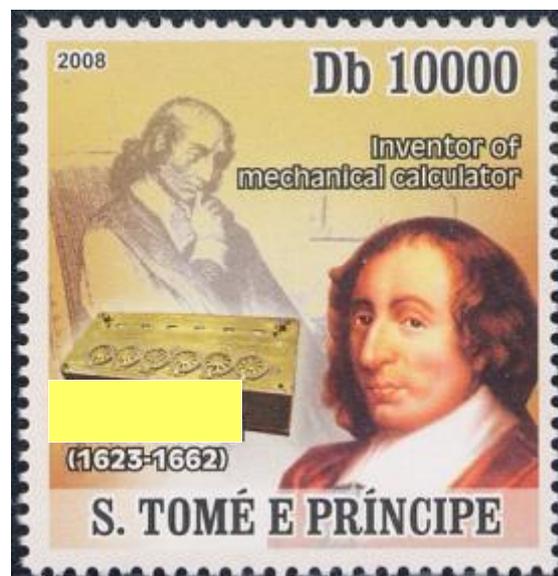
This stamp has been issued by CCCP which is now the country called Russia. Who is the famous mathematician?
